Suggested Supply List

Smock/Apron

Tools

Scissors

x-acto knife and small self-healing cutting mat

a few paintbrushes of various sizes

foam brushes, wedge makeup sponge

(Optional: small gel plate, small brayer(s))

Materials

Acrylic matte medium (fluid or soft)

Small container of acrylic gloss gel (soft)

Small jar of acrylic gesso (white)

Acrylic Paints – a few colors of inexpensive acrylics is fine

Acrylic Inks, India ink

Other mark-making and color materials as desired: Colored pencils/Watercolor pencils, Charcoal pencils,

Pastels, Ink pens/markers, Fillable fine line markers

Substrates for collage

Pad of Bristol, Mixed Media, or watercolor paper (9x12)

Small painting board(s) – 8x8 (wood panel, canvas board; small cradled painting board – the cradled side can be used for more dimensional collage)

Optional: other possible surfaces to explore - small matboard pieces, cardboard, wood pieces, plexiglass (not too big, for manageability in timeframe of class)

Miscellaneous supplies

Freezer paper

Waxed Paper

Plastic wrap

Blue painters tape

Paper towels, Baby wipes

Container(s) for water/Brush cleaning and holding brushes/tools

Papers, collage materials

A small collection (shoe box or manila envelope's worth) of items - such as interesting papers, gel prints, ephemera, text, photos, old magazine and book pages, postcards, pamphlets, tickets, maps, fabric/wallpaper samples, wrapping paper, tissue paper, sewing patterns, commercial packaging, sheet music, stamps, and envelopes, hardware. Choose colors and patterns that please you; collect an assortment of text, color, and pattern. You will cut paper items up, so make copies of anything you want to preserve.

Patterning/Texture Materials:

Stencils if you have them

Rubber Stamps if you have them

Any textured surfaces and mark-making items you can find – cardboard, coffee cup sleeves, bubble wrap, screen fabric, lace, netting (save produce netting, etc.), straws, bottlecaps, string, rubber bands, toilet paper tubes...have fun with this!
