Rockler: Tools, hardware, books, small quantities of wood

Anderson McQuaid: Larger quantities of wood

End Table:

Pick solid wood of your choice. Cherry, walnut, and mahogany are nice but more expensive. Woods like poplar and oak are less expensive. Maple is somewhere in between. Students have done this project in soft woods like pine but it is not generally available in the right dimension in terms of thickness.

You will need:

One Eight Quarter Board ( in other woods 2 inches thick ) 10 inches wide and around 30 inches long for the legs ( or two boards at least 5 inches wide and 30 inches long )

Four quarter inch wood ( one inch thick ) 6 inches wide and 6 feet long for the apron and table top
