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# SUMMERFUN! 2026

## PROGRAM INFORMATION

SummerFun! (SF) offers more than 180 fun and creative classes taught by experienced teachers. Classes are organized into one-week sessions with morning and afternoon options. Pick and choose to customize your child's perfect summer. Children in grades 1-12 from Arlington and other communities are welcome to register.

SF is run by Arlington Community Education, a self-sustaining program of the Arlington Public Schools that receives no local, state, or federal funding.

### Schedule

SF runs for six weeks, **July 6-August 14**. **AM** classes run 9:00-12:00, **PM** classes run 12:30-3:30, unless otherwise noted. A supervised lunch break (12:00-12:30 pm) is included for children who are enrolled in both AM and PM sessions. Children will be escorted to their afternoon classes.

### Extended Day

Early dropoff runs 8:00-9:00 am, Monday-Friday; afternoon extended day runs 3:30-5:30 pm, Monday-Thursday only. Both include supervised activities and free play. Register under "Extended Day" (no partial weeks).

### Grade Levels

SF serves children in grades 1-12. Grade levels should match the grade your child will be entering in the fall of 2026. Sorry, we do not offer programming for children entering kindergarten regardless of age.

### Registrations

All registrations must be made online at [Arlington.Arux.app](https://Arlington.Arux.app). Registration closes Thursday at noon for classes starting the following week. No walk-in registrations allowed.

### Waitlists

If the class your child wants is full, sign them up for the waitlist (credit card required) and we will be in touch via email if a spot becomes available. We will not charge your credit card without permission. *Please do not contact teachers directly about waitlists.*

### Schedule Changes

All withdrawals and transfer requests must be made via email to [SummerFun@arlington.k12.ma.us](mailto:SummerFun@arlington.k12.ma.us) during our business hours (M-F, 9:00 am-4:00 pm). Requests that come outside of those hours will be considered the following day. Fees apply.

### Withdrawals

- Before May 1, refund minus \$25 per class.
- Beginning May 1, refund minus \$50 per class.
- No refunds less than 3 weeks before a class begins.

### Transfers

- 3+ weeks before the start of class, \$25 per class.
- 6-15 business days before the start of class, \$75 per class.
- No transfers are allowed the week before or once the class begins.
- All transfers must be to another SF class.

### Other Terms

- ACE does not issue credits for SF classes.
- No refund will be made for classes missed or dropped including for illness or injury.
- In the unlikely event that ACE cancels a class, every effort will be made to place your child in another class; otherwise, all tuition will be refunded.
- ACE reserves the right to change instructors if necessary.

### Tuition Assistance

Tuition assistance is available on a sliding scale for qualifying Arlington children for up to two weeks. Please visit [www.ArlingtonCommunityEd.org/tuition-assistance](http://www.ArlingtonCommunityEd.org/tuition-assistance). We will contact you once we receive your application.



## Logistics

We will email you the week before your child's class begins with all the details including drop-off, pick-up, parking, what to bring, etc.

## Snacks & Lunch

All children must bring their own lunch, snacks, and water bottle each day.

## Screens & Phones

Children are expected to keep phones, smartwatches, and screens at home, or put away in their backpacks, including at lunch and recess. If you need to reach your child, please call our on-site staff.

We love to use photos and videos of kids in action in our print and digital promotions. We would appreciate your opting in for photo permissions when you register.

## Health/Allergy Protocols

There will be a nurse on duty during *SummerFun!*. If your child requires any medication including an EpiPen or inhaler and/or has an Individual Health Care Plan, please include all details in the *Special Needs* section on your child's online registration profile.

## Special Needs

We want every child to have a positive and successful experience at *SummerFun!* and we know families are the experts on their child. Because *SF* does not have access to school records such as IEPs or 504 Plans, we encourage parents/guardians to share relevant information about medical needs, disabilities, behavioral strategies, or supports that help your child thrive. This information can be entered in the *Special Needs* section on your child's online registration profile.

*SummerFun!* is an equal access program and does not discriminate on the basis of disability. Our programs are not school-sponsored special education services, so the specific accommodations or services a student receives during the school day may not be available in this setting. However, we will work collaboratively with families to identify reasonable modifications that allow for safe and meaningful participation, consistent with program structure, staff qualifications, and applicable laws.

If your child may require a specific accommodation or support, please contact our office as early as possible, ideally *at least three weeks* before the start of the program, so we can learn about your child's needs and discuss what supports may be appropriate.

## Behavior Policy

Children who attend *SummerFun!* are expected to participate in group activities with staff supervision and to interact with peers and staff in a safe and respectful manner. We understand that children may need reminders, support, and flexibility to be successful, and our staff will work with families to understand each child's needs and any helpful strategies.

If a child is having difficulty meeting these expectations, program staff will communicate with parents/guardians to discuss supports or reasonable accommodations that may promote safe and meaningful participation. Families are encouraged to share any helpful information or strategies in the *Special Needs* section in your child's online profile during registration so that we can plan proactively.

When safety concerns or repeated disruptions persist despite reasonable supports, the Director may review whether additional modifications are feasible or whether a different program or setting may better meet the child's needs.
